

Practising an art form in order to learn more about the art AND the research subject? Sounds ideal.

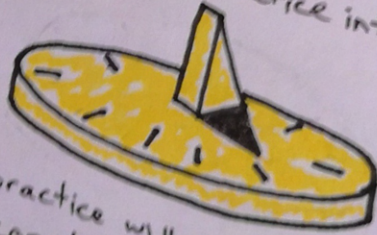
Too much of our education system is focused on passive knowledge consumption and meaningless info regurgitation. PER is ACTIVE.
